

This Governor-appointed workgroup meets every four years. The Workgroup's goal is to create reasonable child support orders for families by reviewing economic and child support data and adjusting income rules.

You can make a difference in how child support works in our state. Several recommendations made by the 2019 workgroup became law, including a reduction in how many hours are required for full-time work based upon real-world realities for working parents.
